The Marine Corps says the transport helicopter was involved in what it **calls** "security and stabilization operations" about 150 kilometers from the Jordanian border. The Marines will not comment on the possible **cause** of the crash, but there was reported to be bad weather in the area, and there are no indications that anyone fired on the helicopter. An investigation is in **progress**.

At a news conference at the White House, President Bush commented on Wednesday's deaths.

President Bush

"The **story** today is going to be very discouraging to the American people. I understand that. We value life. And we weep and mourn when soldiers **lose** their life," said Mr. Bush. But the president said the United States will continue with its mission to **establish** security and democracy in Iraq. "That mission is to enable Iraq to defend herself from terrorists, **home** grown or terrorists that come in from outside of the country," he added. The president said enough U.S. troops will **remain** in Iraq long enough to do the job, and at the same time training will **increase** for Iraq's new security forces.
