BNE: Saudi Arabia's King Fahd died on Monday of respiratory problems. His half-brother Crown Prince Abdullah, the de facto leader of Saudi Arabia since the King's debilitating stroke a decade ago, has been installed as the new monarch. The King's funeral will take place today and will be attended by many of the world's dignitaries. King Fahd reputedly had extremely close links with President Bush's family and was once a close ally of Saddam Hussein. The situation changed when the King granted the U.S. military the right to use Saudi Arabia as a base in the two wars against Iraq. This incurred the wrath of Al-Qaeda who became bent on toppling the Saudi royal family.

King Fahd was 84 years old. His health had rapidly deteriorated since being admitted to hospital with pneumonia on May 27. The Saudi Information Minister announced the news of the King's death on state television: "With deep sorrow and pain, the Royal Court mourns the death of The Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques, King Fahd, due to illness." He will also be mourned around the Islamic world. Pakistan will hold a week of national mourning, with flags flying at half mast. This week's Arab summit in Egypt will be postponed for a few days. The Arab League Secretary General said the King was a true visionary who played a pivotal role in the Middle East, and whose death would be deeply felt.

WARM-UPS
