Argentine president Nestor Kirchner ordered diplomats in Brazil to arrange his release. His travel companion Alejandro Mancuso said Maradona's rage was "logical" because staff "shut the door in our faces".

Maradona has had cocaine and alcohol problems since retiring from professional football in 1997. Mr. Mancuso denied reports in the Brazilian press saying Maradona's anger was because he was drunk. He has also been arrested for gun shootings near his home. Maradona is one of the best, if not the best, players of all time. He is loved and is a hero in much of Latin America. He includes presidents Castro of Cuba and Chavez of Venezuela as his close friends. He took part in protests against U.S. President George W. Bush at a summit in Argentina in November. Maradona has offered to pay for the damage to the airport door.
