Fear and panic are now spreading among Turkey's citizens. Turks were already worried because of the deaths of three children in the east of the country a few days ago. At least two of the youngsters had been playing with the head of a bird that had the deadly H5N1 virus. Turkey's neighbors have reacted quickly. Iran has closed its borders with Turkey and Russia has advised its nationals against any unnecessary visits.

Health officials have told people not to panic. Authorities are currently killing thousands of chickens in the eastern city of Van, the source of the current outbreak. However, politicians have accused the government of being too slow to stop the spread of the virus. The media too have attacked Turkey's health departments for their poor response and lack of preparation. Newspaper editors are asking why Turkey does not have bird flu plans similar to those in Holland or Britain. There are fears that a virus that can pass among humans may soon form, which may start a global pandemic and could kill millions.
