A spokesman for the laboratory said it took a decade of research and trials with more than 3,000 volunteers to produce Esthechoc. The chocolate bar will only be sold in boxes of 21 bars - one a day for three weeks. Other scientists say more research is needed for people to know whether or not Esthechoc actually works.
