yarmouk was established in 1957 to accommodate the huge influx of palestinian refugees from israel it became home to the largest palestinian refugee community in syria before the recent isis incursion around 160000 people lived there life in the camp had already become intolerable for most residents following 18 months of bombing and a siege because of syria's civil war many parts of the camp now resemble a ghost town with shells of bomb-blasted buildings and a civilian population that has fled news agencies report that isis now controls about 90 per cent of the camp syrian authorities are worried isis could use it as a springboard to launch attacks on the capital damascus
