nepal's prime minister sushil koirala has admitted that his government is overwhelmed by the scale of the disaster and is ill-equipped to cope he requested helicopters to help with the distribution of aid however the logistics of this are being hampered by the country's rugged terrain which often makes it difficult for anything to be delivered by air many of the roads have been swept away by avalanches and landslides further exacerbating the problem is the fact that kathmandu's international airport has only one runway which has hindered the delivery of much-needed supplies the un world food program warned that it would take time for aid to reach more remote communities
