Men were the most likely to commit micro crimes. About 80 per cent of middle-class people and 70 per cent of workingclass people admitted to micro crimes. The second-most common micro crime was illegal downloading or streaming. About 30 per cent of people did this. Other micro crimes include not paying for bags in supermarkets, lying about your age to get a better deal, and eating things in a supermarket without paying.
