a whopping 50 per cent more bicycles were sold than cars europeans bought just 12 million cars in 2012 compared to 192 million bicycles sergio marchionne the head of the italian car giant fiat said this was a sorry state of affairs for the car industry and described it as "carmageddon" car sales in italy slumped so badly that they were at their lowest levels since 1965 – a five-decade low the head of the italian cycling federation believes there has been "a small revolution in terms of lifestyle" the head of italian cycling manufacturer bianchi agreed he said "customers these days want bikes they can commute with and top-of-the-range bikes they are looking for long-term investments"
