**BNE:** Can a chimpanzee be an artist? This is the big question in the art world today. People are asking this because a chimpanzee's paintings will be sold at a London auction next month. Congo the chimp painted abstract art. He became famous in the 1950s for producing 400 pictures. He even had his own exhibition at a top London gallery. Dr Desmond Morris, an animal expert, said Congo had a lot of creative talent. Dr Morris thought the chimpanzee was an "intense" artist who was "focused on what he was doing".

Congo used vivid colors in his paintings, which were very popular with the British public. Britons went bananas over Congo and bought nearly all of his pictures. Even Pablo Picasso bought a Congo painting. He framed it and hung it on the wall of his studio. The auction will sell three Congos as well as works by Renoir and Andy Warhol. The chimp's paintings are valued at around \$1,500 each. However, because the news of this auction has spread around the world, they may sell for much more.
