Mother Mei Xiang gave birth in the early hours of the morning to the delight of zoo veterinarians who had been anxiously awaiting the new arrival. They had been on tenterhooks for days in anticipation of the precious and rare birth. The delivery was greeted with whoops of joy by elated zoo staff. The gender of the newborn will be unknown for a few days as it is still too fragile to be taken from its mother. Zoo officials will refrain from intervening between mother and cub to allow the baby bear's immune system to sufficiently develop in the critical first few days.

The birth of a giant panda in captivity is an extremely nerve-racking experience for all concerned. Mei Xiang was artificially inseminated in early March. She had previously had two phantom pregnancies and had shown no signs that she was pregnant this time round until a week ago. Any cubs that are born at the zoo belong to China and are returned when the panda reaches the age of two. For now, the panda team members are keeping their fingers crossed that the cub survives until then. The public will have to wait three months before mother and cub are revealed to the world. However, the zoo has installed webcams for panda addicts to get a sneak preview online at the zoo's website*.
