THE ARTICLE

Russia bans America's ABC TV news team

BNE: Russia's government has banned America's ABC TV news channel from reporting inside Russia. This is because of an ABC interview with Russia's most wanted man, the Chechen warlord Shamil Basayev. He has a \$10 million bounty on his head for acts of terrorism in Russia. He confessed in the interview he was responsible for many terrorist attacks, including those at a Moscow theater in 2002 and a Beslan school in 2004. Russia is furious at ABC for giving Basayev the opportunity to spread his propaganda around the world.

Russia's Foreign Ministry said that ABC's interview with an internationally recognized terrorist supported terrorism. They said it also gave Basayev the chance to directly tell his followers to commit more acts of violence against Russian citizens. Russia made the decision not to provide ABC reporters with work permits. A government spokesperson said: "We will continue to act openly with the press, but ABC will not be invited to the Defense Ministry and no interviews will ever be given to it." ABC said it did not regret broadcasting the interview.

WARM-UPS
