BNE: Thieves have carried out a daring and audacious bank robbery in Brazil, making off with over 88 million US dollars. The stolen cash weighed in at a total of three point five tons. The gang of robbers tunneled 80 meters into a Brazilian Central Bank branch in the north of the country from a rented house several streets away. Over the course of three months, they shored up the tunnel walls with wood and reinforced plastic and installed electric lighting. Neighbors reported nothing suspicious about the house or its occupants, who were supposedly manufacturing artificial turf. They said a truck arrived every day, which was loaded with dozens of large plastic bags and then driven away. They had no inkling a tunnel was being excavated.

Red-faced bank officials in Rio de Janeiro admitted the theft, Brazil's largest, had taken place over the weekend and was discovered by bank workers on Monday morning. Apparently, the money was mostly in small bills and was to be withdrawn from circulation, making it virtually impossible to trace. The heist perfectly fits the storyline taken from a Hollywood movie. A Central Bank spokesperson reported that the bank had the most up-to-date alarm systems, complete with motion sensors, and that the vault was encased in two-meter-thick concrete and steel. He said he was "flabbergasted" by the ingenuity and resolve shown by the robbers. The bank will now immediately review its security systems at all branches to avoid any copycat robberies.
