An angry Sir Paul McCartney has called for a boycott of Chinese goods and the Beijing Olympic Games in 2008. He has also promised never to perform in China again. His anger is because of a secretly filmed BBC documentary, which showed terrible images of cats and dogs being put in boiling water and skinned alive at a Chinese fur market. Chinese Embassy staff in London say the film is a fake. McCartney is an active animal rights campaigner. He said: "This is barbaric. It's like something out of the Dark Ages." He added: "This is just disgusting. It's against every rule of humanity."

The secretly filmed video is full of bloody and disturbing scenes of cats and dogs dying in horrible ways. The BBC cut out many scenes because they were too shocking. Sir Paul called the Chinese "uncivilized" and a "sick, sick people". He said: "How can the host nation of the Olympics be seen allowing animals to be treated in this terrible way?" A Chinese diplomat in London said McCartney was wrong. He said: "Though cats and dogs are not endangered, we do not encourage their ill treatment." He added: "Sir Paul should be calling for a boycott of the fashion industry using fur in the European and American markets."
