In a sign of desperate measures, GM is considering offloading its Hummer brand. Sales of this SUV-cum-tank have plummeted as motorists can no longer afford to fill its tank and keep it on the road. GM chief executive Rick Wagoner said: "At this point, we are considering all options for the Hummer brand...everything from a complete revamp of the product lineup to a partial or complete sale of the brand." He added: "High gas prices are changing consumer behaviour and changing it rapidly. We don't believe it's a spike or a temporary shift. We believe it is, by and large, permanent." Wagoner said the emphasis now was on the production of the Chevrolet Volt, a plug-in electric car, scheduled to be in car showrooms by the end of 2010.
