However, France has the right to expel the Roma if they have no work permit or proof they can support themselves financially. Many of the returned Roma have vowed to go back to France. Ionut Balasz, 26, said: "Of course I'm thinking about returning to France. Life is better there than in Romania." The Romanian foreign minister Teodor Basconschi said: "What has happened in Paris shows that we must have an integration plan across Europe for Roma citizens."
