US President Obama told British royalty at a Buckingham Palace banquet that the "special relationship" between Britain and the USA was as strong and important as ever. Mr and Mrs Obama are on a state visit to the UK and attended the special dinner along with politicians, movie stars and business leaders. President Obama hailed the friendship between the two nations, particularly since the 9/11 terror attacks. He said: "As we approach the 10th anniversary of 9/11, I'm particular grateful for the solidarity that the United Kingdom has shown to America over the past decade....From that day to this, you have been our closest partner." He praised the Queen, calling her "a living witness to the power of our alliance and a chief source of its resilience".

Britain's Queen Elizabeth echoed the president's words. She said: "We are here to celebrate the tried, tested and - yes - special relationship between our two countries....I firmly believe that the strength of our links and many shared interests will continue to ensure that, when the US and the UK stand together." The British monarch went on to describe the US as, "our most important ally" and said the world was a "more secure" place when the USA and the UK stood together. A royal spokesperson said the special relationship also existed between the Obamas and the Queen's family, saying: "Very warm words have been spoken between the royal family and the Obamas. There is a genuine, genuine — and I really mean this — a genuine warmth between the two families."
