sony canceled the release of its movie "in the interests of public safety" after several us cinema chains refused to screen it this has caused a storm of protest in america president obama said "we cannot have a society in which some dictators some place can start imposing censorship here" he added "imagine what they start doing once they see a documentary that they don't like or news reports that they don't like" senator john mccain called the cyber-attack "an act of war" and "the greatest blow to free speech" he had seen in his lifetime another politician said "america has lost its first cyberwar" actor rob lowe tweeted "everyone caved [in] the hackers won an utter and complete victory for them"
