the famous 19th-century fairy tale collector wilhelm grimm suggested fairy tales dated back thousands of years scientists now support his theory and claim that many of the fairy tales we know and love could be over 4000 years old anthropologist jamshid tehrani and folklorist sara da silva say the oldest known fairy tale dates back over 6000 years to the bronze age this is a time between the stone age and iron age when humans first started making tools from metal dr tehrani studied the evolution of our early languages he found strong links between a tale called "the smith and the devil" and the proto-indo-european language - an ancient common language that dates to around 6000 years ago
