The fee to climb Mount Everest will also go up. It will rise from \$11,000 to \$15,000. This is the first increase in ten years. Another new rule is trekkers must prove they climbed a Nepalese mountain over 7,000 metres high. This may get more people to try some of the 97 free mountains.
